The Lenten Season: This month of March 2022, we reflect on the days of the liturgical Church year by considering Ash Wednesday (March 2) and the season of Lent. We just left the month of February with the celebrations of 1) Souper Bowl of Caring Sunday, 2) New Hope's 39th Anniversary, 3) And celebrating Valentine's Day (a day typically reserved for love and romance).

As we leave the month of February, we begin to prepare ourselves (the body of Christ) for the time of the liturgical year when we need to consider our faith walk with God... Are we being faithful or unfaithful? Are we living up to God's expectations of us? This Lenten Season is an excellent time for us to consider, "Have we loved God and lived up to His will and purpose for our lives?"

As we enter March (on Ash Wednesday March 2), we reflect on our mortality— "from dust you came to dust you shall return." We reflect on the holy sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ on our behalf. As we receive the ashes... We say, Bring on the ashes! ... Lord, renew our FAITH!

We are not morbid people, but thinking on our mortality, brings up dreadful thoughts of our humanity. And yet, it is beneficial for us to spend time reflecting on the reality of our mortality. We do this to prepare ourselves to receive the life that God has prepared for us in Christ. And so, during the time in between the day that the Church remembers Jesus' transfiguration and the joyful celebration of Easter, we embark upon our forty-day pilgrimage of Lent.

This year it just so happens that our observance of Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent is preceded by the "Month of Love." We might even say, its sprinkled with a dose of vivid irony... Why? Because our solemn journey on Ash Wednesday reflects on our unfaithfulness, our lack of love for God, and yet, God continues to surround us with His abounding love in the mist of Ash Wednesday and on the pilgrimage of our Lenten journey.

The word Lent comes from the old English word for "spring." We could say, "Lent is "spring training" for Christians as we are tutored in faith, repentance, and holy living. It's when we should set-aside time for personal devotions and self-denial. It's a time for us to cultivate a faithful heart that dwells on God's Word and His faithfulness to us.

Beginning in the (fourth century) the observance of Lent originally became connected with a forty day fast prior to Easter. This tradition continues today as some Christians during Lent give up a particular food, or a vice like sweets, or chocolate, or coffee, shopping, or television. Some Christians choose to gather for a small meal of soup and salad (while gathering together) every Wednesday during Lent. Some choose to fast on particular days (which is not required but an elective decision). Fasting is a good way to discipline one's body and certainly opens the door for pondering in our time of denial of all God has done for us, and the ultimate sacrifice of Christ on our behalf.

Should you decide to fast during Lent, consider Jesus' words about fasting in His Sermon on the Mount, "And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward." (Matthew 6:16)

The Lenten season begins with Ash Wednesday and the imposition of ashes. In the Moravian Church the imposition of the ashes is a reminder of our mortality. The ashes are the (burned Palm branches collected from Palm Sunday the year before). Genesis 3:19 says, "By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread, till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; for you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

The Sundays in Lent focus on the themes of temptation, God's mercy, the life of a disciple, and the sustenance God gives to (us) His disciples. This year it's my prayer that during the Lenten season, we focus more on God's forgiveness to (us) His disciples and the "Words of Eternal Life" found only in the Cross of Christ Jesus.

May our Lord richly bless our Lenten time together this year, as we together reflect on God's love for us and the sacrifice of His Beloved Son Jesus for us. Through our Lord and Savior Christ Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection; WE are restored to a holy God... WE are forgiven and... WE receive the free gift of "Eternal Life."

Lent begins with *Ash Wednesday and ends with the conclusion of the Great Sabbath (Holy Saturday - Easter Eve) - a span of forty days on the church calendar, excluding Sundays. It is symbolic of the forty days Christ spent fasting and praying in the desert while enduring the temptations of the devil. (Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke)

Lent is generally observed as a time for spiritual renewal; a time for Christians to reflect, repent, and pray as a way of preparing their hearts for Easter and the Resurrection of Christ. Although not dictated or required by the Moravian Church, many of the faithful voluntarily commit to fasting or giving up certain types of luxuries as a form of penitence during the season of Lent.

The three traditional practices to be taken up with renewed vigor during Lent are prayer (justice towards God), fasting (justice towards self), and almsgiving (justice towards neighbor).

Counting Sundays, there are actually 46 days in the Lenten penance (season) - Sundays are excluded because each and every Sunday is considered a celebration of the Resurrection of Christ.



* Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of placing ashes on the foreheads of the faithful as a celebration and reminder of human mortality, and as a sign of mourning and repentance to God. The ashes used are typically gathered from the burning of the palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday.

Thanks to the Moravian Ministries Foundation of America (MMFA), we now have an online option to donate to New Hope via credit card or direct debit (automatic bank to bank transfer). The MMFA provides the portal for this electronic giving and they directly deposit any funds to the New Hope bank account. This is a great option for Friends of New Hope that no longer live in the area. These donations will be tracked for tax filing purposes. Transaction fees do apply, just under 3% for credit card transactions and \$0.75 for direct debit transactions.

The MMFA also provides a means to donate securities/stocks. Your broker transfers the securities/stocks to MMFA and the MMFA executes the securities/stocks into cash. Securities/stocks executed in this way are not subject to capital gains tax. Please contact Tom Schultz if you are interested in the process for this type of monetary transaction.
